Further Information Regarding Elementary Education Requirements:

Social Studies – The two social studies requirements can be fulfilled by taking any ANT, GEO HTY or POS courses which, depending on the courses, could fulfill up to two general education requirements. Please refer to an academic advisor for further details.

Children’s Literature, Elementary Language Arts Methods or the Writing Process – This course can be fulfilled by one of many different courses. Depending on which course one chooses, it may fulfill either an upper-level or lower level elective requirement, or even a humanities. Please refer to an academic advisor for further details.
