Criteria for Grants-in-Aid

Theta Chapter Grants-in-Aid

Grants-in-aid are those monies which a chapter gives to someone who is not a member of the chapter or of Delta Kappa Gamma Society International. Theta Chapter presently has four grants-in-aid: the Patricia H. Thurston Scholarship, A Grant-in-Aid; the Doris S. Heath Scholarship of Theta Chapter, A Grant-in-Aid; the Charlotte S. Morse Memorial Scholarship, A Grant-in-Aid; and the Recruitment Grant-in-Aid.

Patricia H. Thurston Scholarship, A Grant-in-Aid (\$250.00)
Established in 1993 by Patricia H. Thurston

Doris S. Heath Scholarship of Theta Chapter, A Grant-in-Aid (\$250.00)
Established in 1967 in memory of Doris S. Heath
(a graduate of Ellsworth High School will be given first priority over all other applicants)

Charlotte S. Morse Memorial Scholarship; A Grant-in-Aid (\$500.00)
Established in 1995 in memory of Charlotte S. Morse
(the recipient of this scholarship must be an Ellsworth High School graduate)

Recruitment Grant-in-Aid (\$200.00)
First given December, 1951
(may also be given to a non-member of Delta Kappa Gamma Society International who is pursuing study in education as a means of returning to the teaching profession)

Eligibility Requirements for all Grants-in-Aid:

Theta Chapter Grants-in-Aid are given to outstanding, female, high school graduates residing in Hancock County or graduates of Hancock County high schools. They must be pursuing under-graduate study in education at an accredited institution either full or part-time, and have successfully completed their sophomore year in college.

Selection is made by the Theta Chapter Scholarship Committee.
