Thursday 4-6:45PM Lawrence Merckens

Concerned with verbal and nonverbal communication that takes place among individuals during interpersonal interaction. Typical areas of concern are perceiving others, presenting one's self, conversation and barriers to communication. Activities may include games, exercises and role playing. Credits: 3

Monday 4-6:45PM Julie Hendrickson

Intensive practice in expository writing with reading of illustrative materials. Required of all students. Prerequisite: Appropriate Accuplacer score or 530 on SAT. Credits: 3

29271 ENG 102W Introduction to Literature UMA

Monday 10AM-12:45PM Ellie Leo

A general introduction to literary genres--the essay, short story, novel, drama, & poetry--including a study of critical terminology, close textual reading, & practice in writing. Six papers, at least one dealing with each genre, will be required. Prerequisite: ENG 101 College Writing. Credits: 3
